You can tattle with crochet yarn, such as AISA brand. It has a silky smooth texture. The finer the thread, the higher

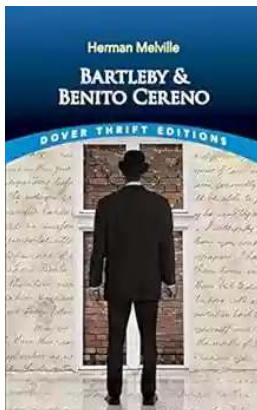
the number. Design size is also affected by thread size. Consider the scope of your project before you choose a thread. Consider how often the item is used.

Types of Tatting

Needle Tatting- Needle tatting can be compared to knitting. The project size is determined by the needle's size. The needle size determines the project's size. Needle tatting uses mock rings, whereas needle tatting uses needles.

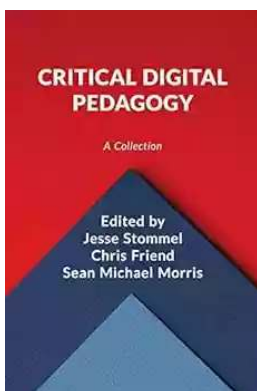
Shuttle Tatting - This was the original method for tatting lace. To make knots, the shuttle guides the thread through a loop and holds it.

Crochet - This is a combination between crochet and needle tatting. This tool is a tatting knife with a crochet hook.



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
