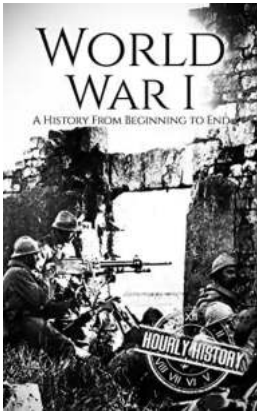

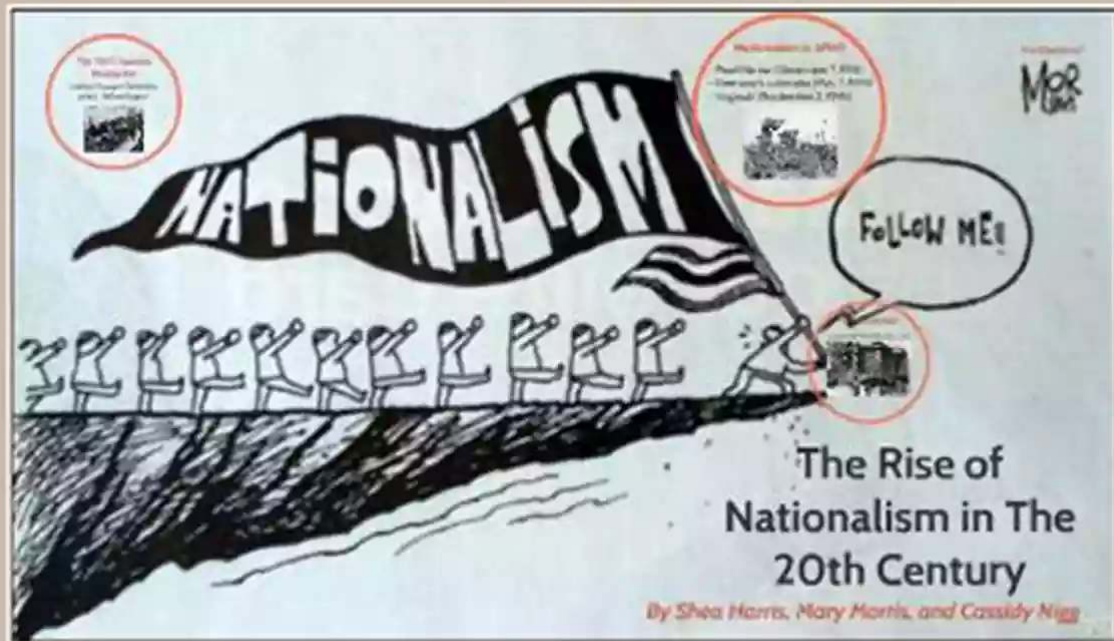

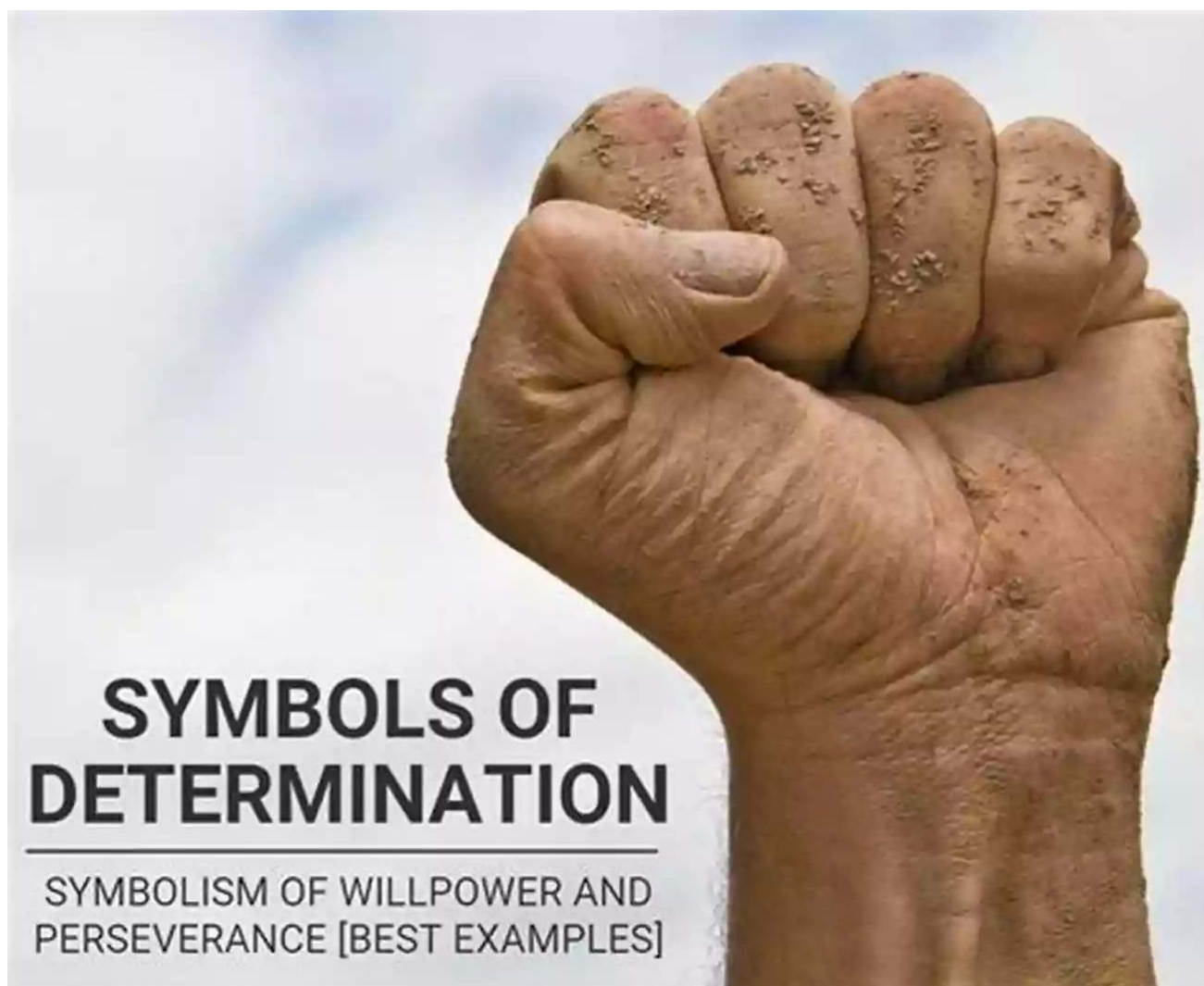

and destruction. It serves as a call to action to learn from past mistakes and work towards fostering a world grounded in cooperation and understanding.

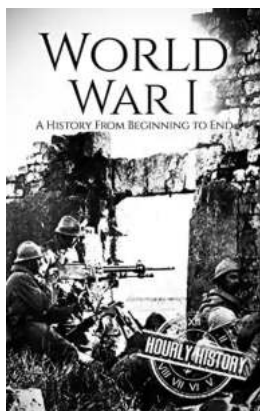
