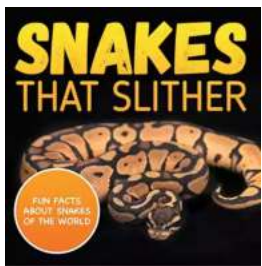

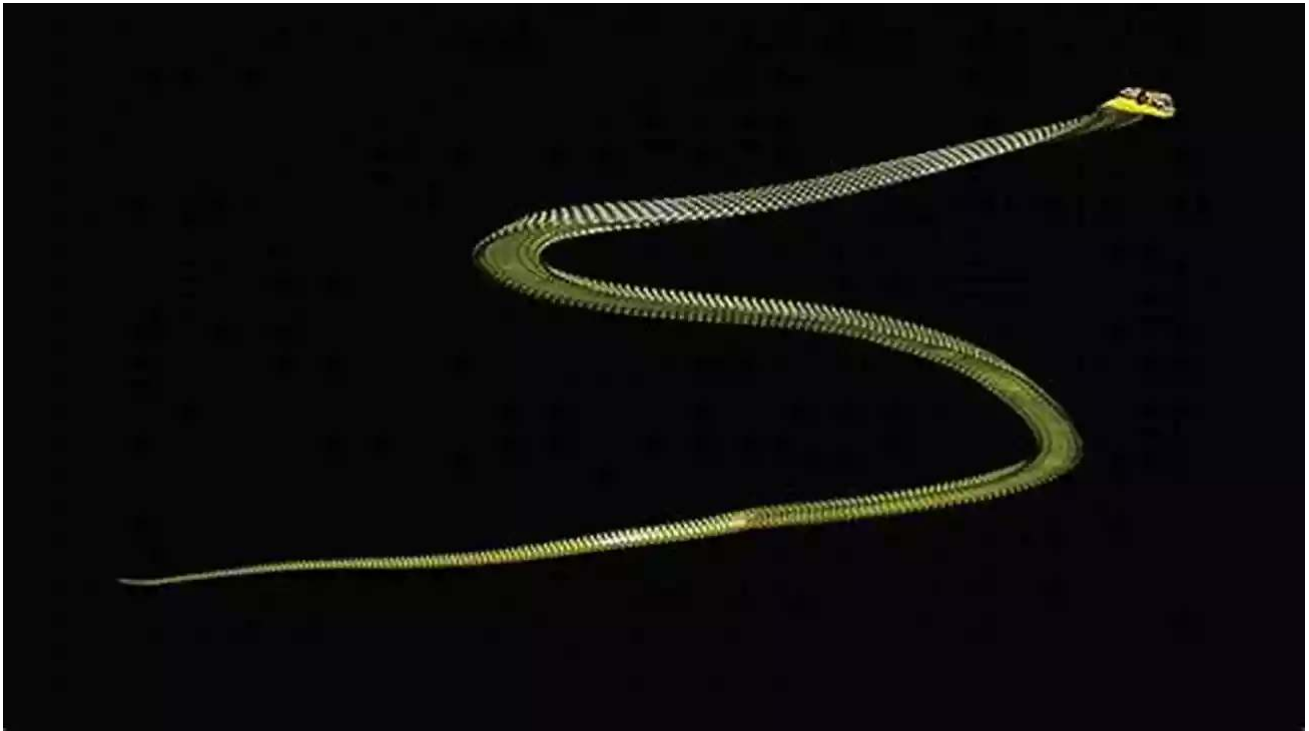
The King of Venom: Inland Taipan
