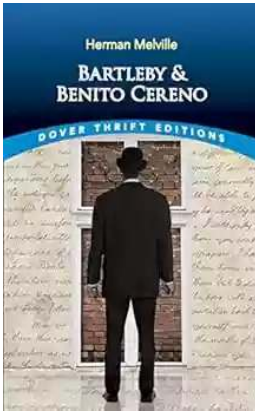

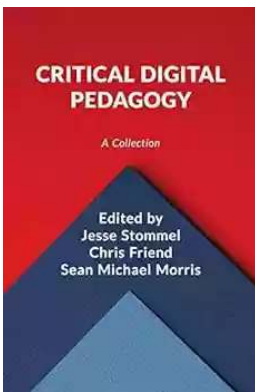
Home Is Where My People Are
