↖ In an uncomplicated, almost plain format, this book teaches the pure technique of thumb position. As it doesn't have much explanation, it is intended for use with an instructor.

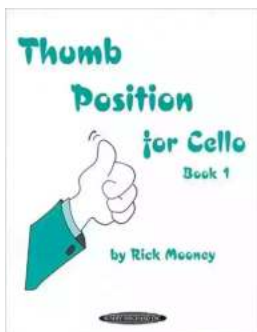

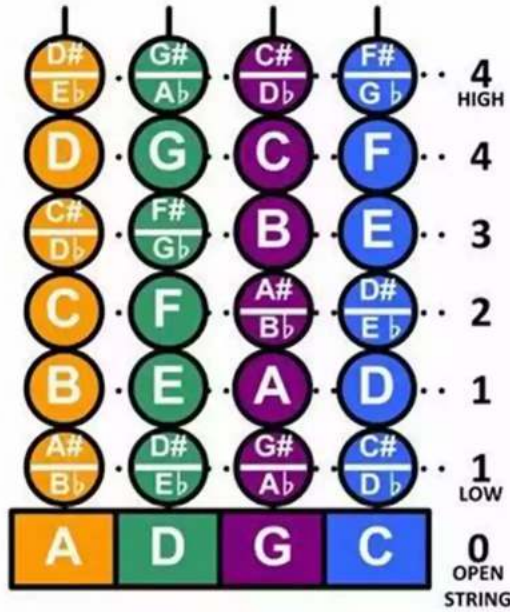

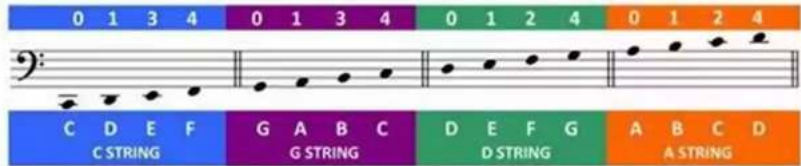
