Gastronomic Delights





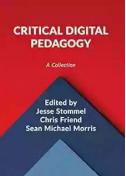
