
Vikings 50 All Time Greatest Players In Franchise History




2. Adrian Peterson (2007-2016)



Adrian Peterson, known as "AP," was a force to be reckoned with during his tenure with the Vikings. His combination of power, speed, and agility made him


one of the most dominant running backs in NFL history. Peterson holds several franchise records and was a seven-time Pro Bowler.

3. Randy Moss (1998-2004, 2010)





4. Paul Krause (1968-1979)





5. Alan Page (1967-1978)





6. Chris Doleman (1985-1993, 1999)





8. Jim Marshall (1961-1979)






10. Randall McDaniel (1988-1999)




